Dear Parents/Guardians,

On January 5, 2011, Governor Chris Christie signed into law P.L. 2010, Chapter 122 known as the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights. This law requires that schools respond to all reports of harassment, intimidation or bullying (HIB) within strict timelines. Districts must appoint an anti-bullying specialist and school safety team to address HIB in each school as well as establish a district-wide anti-bullying coordinator. Under the law, anti-bullying training, education and prevention programs are required for all students and staff members. The legislation also requires all school districts to adopt a policy prohibiting harassment, intimidation or bullying and to establish consequences and/or appropriate remedial action for students who are involved in acts of HIB.

The law was revised last year with respect to how a school district may view a reported incident or complaint. Specifically, district policies may now be revised to include a process prior to initiating an HIB investigation whereby the principal, or his/her designee, in consultation with the anti-bullying specialist, may make a "preliminary determination" as to whether a reported incident or complaint, assuming that all facts presented in a given case are true, meets the minimum legal criteria to establish an incident of HIB as defined by N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14. Cranford's HIB Policy, #5512, a copy of which is enclosed, contains the ability for such a preliminary determination to be made. As set forth in the policy, if a preliminary determination finds the reported incident or complaint does not meet the minimum legal criteria to establish an incident at N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14, the parents/guardians of the involved students will be notified and other more expedient possibilities for responding to the reported issue(s) in the reported incident or complaint will be explored. As also set forth in the District's HIB Policy, a preliminary determination that the reported incident or complaint does not meet the minimum legal criteria to establish an incident of Education and thereafter to the Commissioner of Education in accordance with the requirements set forth at N.J.A.C. 6A:3.

If upon being notified of the District's preliminary determination, the parents/guardians reporting the incident or complaint want the matter investigated as a possible HIB under the law, the District will request that the parents/guardians advise their child's principal in writing, and the District will conduct an HIB investigation.

As noted, a copy of our HIB policy is enclosed so you may further familiarize yourself with how the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights is carried out in our schools.
